ARMED ROBBERIES:

Armed Robberies have been on the rise, especially within the store groups that are open a little later for customer convenience. The number of robberies has increased from 2004 to 2005.

The robberies are becoming more violent with little consideration for women, children or any human life. The gangs are large, between 12 20 members, and more often than not, are heavily armed. The robberies are not particularly on specific days but rather in the evenings during closing time, 17:30 19:00.

This is where the best practice for Armed Robberies, on the CGC Crime Website comes into play. Cash handling management is vital; this is where the key to safety and less cash loss lays, REMOVE CASH!!! Clear tills constantly. Please note the CGC Crime Prevention Programme also has red boards that show our office number, crime stops contact details, and blank spaces to fill in your nearest police stations details with other details too. When a disturbing incident like an armed robbery occurs, you tend to forget telephone numbers and what to do after the situation. The CGC Offices will also be developing a handy hand held card with tips and lists on what to do thereafter these tragic incidents.





BANTSHOTSHILE - THEFT PROCESS WITH ID CARDS

Bantshotshile, translated into English is: They have stolen. It is the name given to the process of ID cards once an incident has occurred within the store.

The process takes place when there has been an incident within any of the 7 major retail store groups with a person carrying the newly instated Id cards. The incidents include theft of store products, consuming any store products and fraudulent and / or suspicious cards to name a few.

The procedure is: Once an incident has taken place, the store will fill out the form that has been provided with all the necessary information and, will fax / email it through to me.

We then get in contact with the company that the person, who was caught, works for and follow up confirming that the company knows of the incident and that the company has done the necessary procedures with regards to disciplinary hearings and so forth.
